Frequently Asked Questions (League FAQs)

DO I HAVE TO TRYOUT TO PLAY IN A BURNING RIVER LEAGUE?

No. We run our leagues as recreational leagues. Everyone is allowed to participate and everyone who registers plays. Please be aware that in our leagues we try to play everyone as evenly as possible.

I SAW SOMETHING ABOUT TRYOUTS WHAT WAS THAT?

We run several travel teams that compete at National and Regional tournaments. Players must tryout to participate on those teams. More information on our travel team offerings can be found under the tournament button.

WHAT DOES THE LEAGUE PROVIDE?

The league provides the facility, referees, scorekeepers, coaches, goals and game balls.

WHAT EQUIPMENT MUST MY SON WEAR?

Each player must bring a full set of equipment (helmet, shoulder pads, arm pads, gloves, athletic cup, mouth piece, and stick) to each game. Goalies must wear a throat guard. **NO EXCEPTIONS !**

DO WE NEED TO PURCHASE A UNIFORM/PINNIE?

Individual registrants must purchase a maroon/white reversible BR Lax pinnie for \$20. If you already have a pinnie you **DO NOT** have to purchase one.

Teams are responsible for their own pinnies. Pinnies must be reversible (2 colors) have numbers and all team members must match. Teams may purchase BR Lax pinnies if they so choose. Pinnies/Uniforms must be worn for every game or you will not play, **NO EXCEPTIONS !**

DOES BURNING RIVER PROVIDE MEDICAL INSURANCE?

Burning River Lacrosse does not provide medical insurance. All players must have their own medical insurance.

DOES BURNING RIVER PROVIDE US LACROSSE MEMBERSHIP?

Burning River Lacrosse does not provide US Lacrosse membership. All players are highly encouraged to be a member of US Lacrosse. To become a member of US Lacrosse, please sign up online at www.uslacrosse.org.

CAN WE ENTER AS A TEAM?

Players wishing to enter as a team must register as individuals (be aware of the league minimum and maximums) and note their team request on the registration form under Comments/Travel Issues/Teammate requests, etc.: Please remember that teams are responsible for their own pinnies. Pinnies must be reversible (2 colors) have numbers and all team members must match. Teams may purchase BR Lax pinnies if they so choose.

WHAT IS THE REFUND POLICY?

League fee refunds will only be granted on the basis of medical emergencies / conditions. All refund requests must be in writing and a letter / documentation from the doctor / hospital of record must accompany the request verifying the medical emergency / condition. Refund requests will be charged a \$25 paperwork fee and be prorated based on when they are received.

WILL PLAYING IN THIS LEAGUE IMPACT MY ELIGIBILITY FOR HIGH SCHOOL?

Rest assured that because the leagues are played under OHSAA / OHSLA rules and regulations and run by an outside agency (Burning River Lacrosse) playing in any of our leagues will not affect your eligibility on your High School, Middle School or Youth team. The teams of our league(s) have no affiliation to the OHSLA/OHSAA or to any school that fields a lacrosse team

WHAT IS THE GAME FORMAT?

Unless otherwise noted, games are 23 minute, running time halves with a 2 minute half time. If necessary, overtime will be a braveheart "sudden victory" format. The first team to score in the overtime period shall be declared the winner. Note: During the braveheart at least one player (goalie or field player) must remain on the defensive side of the field. It is imperative that you show up on time. As games run back to back, all players must be ready to play (equipment on and warmed up) when the game ahead of them finishes.

HOW ARE TEAM ASSIGNMENTS MADE?

All players not registering as a team will be assigned to a team. Teams are put together depending on the number of players coming from a particular area. The maximum number of players allowed on a team is 14 (13 and 1 Goalie) for 6 on 6, 17 (16 and 1 Goalie) for 7 on 7, and 25 (24 and 1 goalie) for 10 on 10. The minimum number of players allowed on a team is 11 (10 and 1 Goalie) for 6 on 6, 12 (11 and 1 Goalie) for 7 on 7, and 15 (14 and 1 goalie) for 10 on 10. Individual players will be added to teams that require a player.
