- Parents and players don't know what they don't know and the process can become overwhelming.
- Demonstrating a great attitude is key. Recognize that nothing is owed to you just because you're a good athlete.

College Recruiting / Selection

(Overall Themes)

Know why you are going to college

• The goal of college is to get a job. Playing sports is a bonus

You have to own the process

- Plan on hours / weeks of work
- \$40,000 a year / \$200,000 decision
- It is not a lottery your ability / effort determines the outcome
- Parents you need to make sure your child is owning the process.

What actually matters / What to focus on.

Grades, Character, Majors, Ability, Fit

College Recruiting / Selection

(Things To Know Before You Start)

- Honestly assess your finances and goals before you start
 - Debt matters don't handicap your kid.
- Things to be aware of
 - You become a college prospect on your first day of high school
 - You have to adjust your timelines because you are a spring sport
 - There are limited scholarships (D1 12.6, D2 10.8)
 - In our experience 95%+ of players get more in academic aid than athletic aid.
 - The difference between a Commit & a Preferred Walk-On spot.
 - You have to clean up your VM and social media (make them professional)





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CONTACT COACHES CONSISTENTLY

- Be your own advocate and keep your name out there! * New video, grades, big games, etc.
- ☑ Let them know of your interest/no longer interested
- Ask where do you stand / what's their timeline
- ☑ Practice your calls before you make them



HAVE COACH MAKE CALLS

- ✓ Once you have it down to schools you would commit to ask your club coach or school coach to contact them.
- ✓ Have a reason why that school.



ESSAYS GALORE

- ☑ Write your college essays (common app)
- Be your own advocate, stand out, sell why
- Be interesting. Avoid the same old stuff

(Senior Year)

- Academics (Focus on grades!)
 - Review / Update your 4 year plan
 - Don't slack off!!!
 - Review HS / internal deadlines
- College Selection
 - Adjust your college list to 3 8 schools based on grades, focus and skills
 - Oct 1 FAFSA (Parents)
 - Complete applications before deadlines
 - Apply for all scholarships

- Athletic
 - Watch de-commits for spots
 - Contact coaches weekly / visits
 - Let them know if you are not interested
 - NLI /Final amateurism certification
- Acceptances
 - Review / discuss Fin Aid packages
 - Send in deposit / acceptance
 - Send final transcripts
 - Register for orientation (early)
 - Summer Training / Conditioning

College Recruiting / Selection (A List Of Don'ts)

- Don't take the" D1 or bust" route or limit yourself to just 1 or 2 schools.
- · Don't forget to check your e-mail / vm regularly, always respond to coaches quickly.
 - *Don't* burn any bridges or blow off coaches
- Don't have your parents contact the school for you.
- Don't worry about what other players you know are doing, worry about yourself.
- Don't freak out if things are not progressing as quickly as you thought they would.
- *Don't* assume just because you have talent, schools will come to you be proactive.
- Don't have a non professional e-mail address, voicemail or unset-up VM
- Don't screw up with social media / character matters your actions can get coaches fired!
- Don't wear other schools gear on visits.

College Recruiting / Selection

(Parents Role)

- Provide them with the skills they need to be successful Study habits, expectations, etc
- Help them navigate the process like a job search. You must hold hands, show them how, help write letters, proof emails, create resumes, review courses, provide advice, create questions to ask, do mock phone calls, etc. they cant do it without you!!!
- Be honest from the start about your finances and what they can expect.
 - Help them make good decisions that set them up for the next 40 years.
- Don't make calls, write essays, etc for them its not your college selection process, it is theirs
 - Help them learn to be responsible and own the process.

College Recruiting / Selection (Re Cap - A List Of things to do's)

- Start early and make it a priority
- Create a plan and work it
- Make it a team effort (Parents, players, family, friends).
- Expand your skill set (communication, writing) and marketability (what are you selling?)
- Take charge. Reach out to coaches versus waiting for them to find you.
- Let schools know that you have an interest don't hide it
- Contact other college personal (admissions, departments, etc)
- Get people on your side who can support your application
- Be professional (vm, email, social media)
- Accept that there will be hiccups, setbacks and disappointments. They don't define you!!
